

Storefront Improvement Grant Program

The Nelson County Job Development Authority (NCJDA) offers the Storefront Improvement Grant Program to assist Nelson County businesses and property owners in updating commercial buildings.

Purpose

- a. To improve the storefront presentation
- b. To assist local business and property owners in reducing the cost of capital improvements that increase the visual appeal of a building.

Goals

- a. To improve the visual appearance of storefronts in Nelson County
- b. To incentivize continued revitalization of Nelson County's business districts by leveraging public funds
- c. To encourage new businesses to relocate to vacant buildings
- d. To lower the cost of property improvements for business owners
- e. To assist businesses in expanding their customer base

Eligible Improvements (include but are not limited to)

- External doors or windows
- Awnings or canopies
- Signs
- Permanent outdoor lighting
- Exterior paint, siding, etc.
- Reconfiguration of entrances

Grant Requirements

Overview & Eligibility

- 1. Matching grant of up to \$5,000 per project, but no more than 50% of the cost of improving the business's storefront.
 - a. Applicants must match the public funds 1:1.
 - b. Matching funds cannot be county mill dollars.
 - c. Applicant shall submit written estimate(s) with the application.
 - d. Sales tax dollars are not reimbursable.
 - e. For projects in Lakota, the public funds would be matched 50/50 by the City of Lakota and NCJDA since Lakota has its own Storefront Improvement Project. Projects must be eligible for both programs.
- 2. Applicants must have a valid ND sales and use tax permit, if applicable.
- 3. Applicants must be either commercial property owners or tenants of a commercial property.
 - a. If a tenant would like to apply for a project, written consent for the specific improvements must be obtained from the property owner.
 - b. Proof of property ownership or lease terms may be required in order to process the grant application.

Review & Approval

- 1. Nelson County JDA determines grant awardees by a majority vote.
- 2. Whenever possible, work shall not commence prior to application approval.
 - a. If work has commenced prior to application approval, it must have started within the last 4 months.

Project Completion & Disbursement

- 1. The applicant is strongly encouraged to purchase all supplies in Nelson County, whenever possible.
- 2. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure all local, city, county, and/or state building permits and codes are obtained and followed. The NCJDA will not be liable for any infraction.
 - a. The Nelson County JDA may request a review of the applicable improvements by a certified code enforcer at the expense of the applicant prior to finalizing the grant award.
- 3. Disbursement of grant award will occur after the approved project is completed and all applicable receipts are submitted.
 - a. All work must be completed within one (1) year of the application being approved unless prior authorization is received.
 - b. Improvements must be maintained for at least three (3) years or grant dollars may be recalled.
- 4. A business and/or property owner can receive the grant once every two (2) years with a maximum lifetime award of \$25,000.
 - a. If the property or business is sold or rented, the new proprietor is fully eligible for the grant with the lifetime award being reset.
